On the Premises, on TUESDAY, 3d July next,

ALL that Farm of LAND, in the Townland of Ballycormick, Parish of Banger, and County of Down, now in the possession of JOHN AGNEW; containing, by common estimation, 57 Acres, and 1 Rood, Cunningham measure; held under the Right Honourable the Lord DUFFERIN, during three lives, at the yearly rent of £57, 10s. 6d.

The above Farm is situate on the Road leading from Bangor, by Groomsport, to Donaghadee, being two miles from the former, and three from the latter, commanding a beautiful view of the whole entrance of Belfast Lough, by which it is bounded on the north. There is an excellent Kelp shore, held at the small Rent of £1, 6s. 6d. yearly. Abundance of shelly sand and sea weed can be procured.

The Land is of prime quality, and in a fair state of cultivation.
